Races start at 5pm on Saturday 15th July, entirely within the safe confines of Sanders Park, Bromsgrove. Everyone who finishes gets a race medal and a big cheer as they cross the line, and there are prizes for the first three home in each age category. In previous years there have been over 150 children taking part. If mums and dads and older brothers and sisters fancy a go too then there are challenging 5k and 10k runs too.
