We have had another busy week at Meadows with children now settled into their new classes and routines. Trips and visitors are being organised to enhance the children's curriculum and learning experiences. This week year 2 enjoyed a visit from the RNLI to teach them about keeping safe around water.

We have seen a big change in weather this week! This makes walking to school more difficult and hence more cars are trying to park around school. At busy times, please be careful around the school gates where pupils and parents, often with pushchairs, are needing to walk on pavements safely. The car park is primarily for staff. Once staff are in school, as a safety measure, the gates are locked during busy times so that parents can walk children safely across the car park to the school entrances.

Absence: If your child is ill please telephone school at the earliest opportunity. If there is no answer, please leave a message to briefly explain the reason for absence. We have seen an increase in children experiencing sickness and flu like illnesses. If your child has a sickness bug you are required to keep them off school for 48 hours after the last sickness episode
