

Phonics

We are so pleased with the progress that the children are making in Phonics. We have now introduced the letters s,a,t,p,i,n,m,d,g,o,c and k. The children have been taught how to correctly pronounce these sounds as well as how to form them. They have been blending and segmenting 3 letter words using these letters. Reading

The children have continued their group reading in school with a new book. They have read a book in a group 3 times with adults and will be bringing their book home today. Please share the book with your child 3 more times. The intention is that the children will become fluent while reading this book so that they can read it without blending each word individually. This may also involve them reading from memory. They can change their **Star Book** as often as they wish.

Mathematics We have had a super week exploring repeating patterns, We have looked at all sorts of patterns, including patterns made with sounds, shapes and colours. Some children have been able to explore patterns made with 3 different things.

Next week we will begin our Its Me, 123! theme in Maths. We will be looking at the numerals that represent the numbers as will as physical and visual representations. The children will discuss the relationships between groups of 1,2 and 3.

Round the goat's face, up to his ear; down and curl under his chin.




Make your mouth into round shape and say ooo
