Friday 10th November

The children have come back to school very settled after their half term break. They seem well rested and ready for everything we will be doing over the next half term. This will be a very busy half term as we get closer to Christmas, with lots going on within our school days.

This week we have started our new "Heroes" theme. We have spent this week thinking about real life heroes and have been lucky enough to have already had a visit from a fire fighter. Next week, we will get the chance to meet some police officers. We will continue to think about real heroes, as well as discussing poppies and remembrance day. We will also be exploring the Hindu festival of Diwali which, this year, falls on Sunday

12th November. We wish everyone celebrating on Sunday a very happy day. Please send in any pictures of Diwali celebrations so we can look at them together in class.

Phonics

This week we have introduced the digraphs ff, ll and ss as well as j. We have discussed how these are usually found in the middle or at the end of words. We have also increased our focus on "tricky words". These are words that don't follow normal phonics rules. So far we have introduced tricky words the, I, is and as. We teach the children to recognise these words by sight. So please stick them up on your fridge, or somewhere!

Reading

The children are making super progress with their reading. Many children are starting to blend independently using the sounds they have been taught. We read the book that they bring home on **Friday 3 times in school** before they bring it home so that they can read to you with confidence and expression.

Mathematics

We have been looking closely at 4-sided shapes this week; discussing properties of these shapes and what the shapes look like when they are rotated. The children have sorted lots of shapes and have been identifying these shapes in their environment.


