This year's theme is **Time** and all week, the children have been taking part in a whole range of activities and investigations which they have thoroughly enjoyed. The activities have been carefully planned to ensure that they align with the

school's own science curriculum so that they have really enhanced the learning outcomes for the children.





Advice on Gaming


