A message from Mr Satchwell

The theme in school this week has been perseverance and the children have really picked up on the importance of this in all they do. As you will see, the teachers have really been encouraging this important life skill in lessons and all the Meadows Mouse Awards have been awarded to children who have really lived this value this week.

The department for education continue to focus on attendance in schools after the pandemic which has had a very significant and negative impact on schools nationally. As part of this focus, all schools now have to report attendance registers daily to the department for education alongside new fines for unauthorised absence being brought under a new national framework. The changes to fines will not come into effect until September 2024 but I wanted to inform you of these changes in plenty of time so that you are fully aware of the statutory changes taking place. The fines will primarily relate to 5 days or more of unauthosrised absence over a set period of time. Below is a summary of the changes so that

you can read a full breakdown of how penalties might be applied. It is really important to keep us informed if you begin to face any issues or barriers to maintaining your child's attendance in school. We have many methods of supporting good attendance so please get in touch if you need to.

With the introduction of the new national framework for penalty notices, the following changes will come into force for penalty notice fines issued after 19th August 2024.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.

These sessions DO NOT have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence.

The 10- school week period can span different terms or school years.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent for each child that was absent.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a penalty notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence

(within 3 years)

The second time a penalty notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child within 28 days.

Third offence and any further offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court. Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2500.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' court can show on the parents future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.
